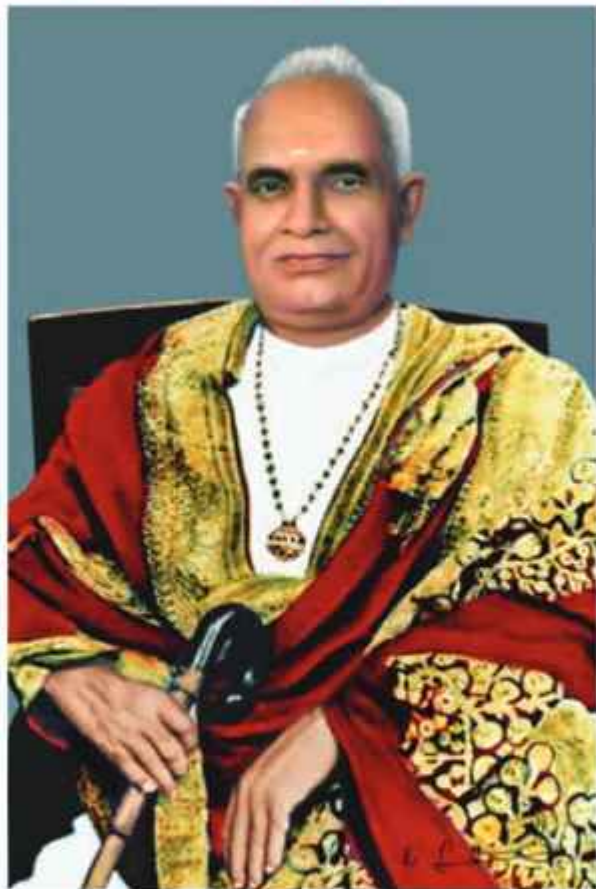

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Pazhassi Raja N. S. S. College is named after the great patriot **Sri. Kerala Varma Pazhassi Raja**, the Martyr who stands unique among the rich array of freedom fighters, and was founded by the illustrious leader, social reformer and great educationalist Padmabhooshan **Sri. Mannathu Padmanabhan**. Pazhassi Raja N.S.S. College had its beginning as a junior College in 1964. Now it is one among the several educational institutions of **Nair Service Society** (N.S.S.), a leading organisation which renders its contribution to various service areas with several institutions of higher learning, like Arts and Science Colleges, Training Colleges, Engineering Colleges, Polytechnics, High Schools, Higher Secondary Schools, Vocational Higher Secondary Schools, Hospitals and Paramedical Institutions.

This College is the fulfilment of the long cherished aspirations of socially and educationally backward people in the eastern side of Kannur district. In the initial periods of its establishment this was the only institution to meet the requirements of higher education of the people in the neighbouring villages.

Sri. M.P. Moidu Haji, the first local committee chairman whose services for the establishment of the college are unforgettable, laid the foundation stone of the College on 19th April 1964. We have here an extensive campus of over 105 acres donated by the generous members of the local public.

The inauguration of the Degree Courses was solemnised by the then President of Nair Service Society, Sri. Kalathil Velayudhan Nair on 12th August 1967. Since 1999, Post Graduate course in Commerce (M.Com.) has been offered by the college. Since its beginning, we are proud to say that it has been progressively achieving excellence in curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. On 4th September 2010, National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, accredited the College with B grade. **Now the college is reaccredited by NAAC with B+ grade on 30.10.2017.** In addition to academic achievements, the college has a unique reputation for sports and games. The college has marked its prestigious presence in Volley Ball at University & Inter University level tournaments for several years.

Formerly the College was affiliated to Kerala University and with the formation of Calicut University the college came under it. Now the college is affiliated to Kannur university.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

ADMISSION

1. Application for admission must be made in the prescribed form which can be had from the College office on payment of the registration fee of Rs. 50.

2. Candidates selected for admission will be required to appear for an interview with the Principal. The selection is provisional and is subject to confirmativon only after the interview and scrutiny of certificates.

3. Students seeking admission to the College from other universities should apply for University recognition.

4. Candidates seeking admission must produce at the time of the interview the transfer and conduct certificates in original from the school or college they last attended, besides the qualifying certificates and mark lists.

5. Candidates who are selected for admission will have to pay the instalments of tuition fees due at the time of admission, caution deposit and all other fees prescribed by the college before they start attending classes. Fees once paid will not be refunded.

6. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fee she/he may have paid.

7. Students belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and the converts from these castes and tribes as evidenced by their SSLC certificate need not pay the tuition fees. Students belonging to other backward classes and converts from them should produce community and income certificates from the regional Tahsildar at the time of admission, failing which they will not be exempted from the payment of fees.

8. A student applying for a transfer certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/she pays all fees or other dues or such portion thereof as the Principal may deem fit to demand for the academic year in which he/she was last enrolled. Usually transfer certificates are not issued to students before the completion of their course of study.

9. A fee of Rs. 55/- will be charged if a student applies for TC after one year from the date of beginning of the academic year immediately following that during which he/she has been last enrolled. A fee of Rs. 105/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate transfer certificate.

10. Students who leave the college on TC are not eligible to get a conduct certificate for the second time. However duplicate of the certificate originally released will be issued.

11. A student applying for the return of his/her SSLC book or any other certificate from the college must have cleared all his/her dues to the college. If any document is desired to be sent by post sufficient postal stamps to cover postage and registration should accompany the application.

12. A student applying for the release of a document from the College must have cleared all dues to the college.

13. A late fee of Rs. 5/- will be charged for a document that needs reference to records older than five years.

FEE RULES

1. Fee structure and rules are liable to be modified in keeping with the directions and orders issued by the Kannur University and the Government of Kerala from time to time.

2. Tuition fees shall be collected in two instalments in the months of June and November for degree courses and in two instalments in the months of June and November for P.G Courses. In the case of first year students the first instalment of fees shall be collected at the time of admission along with the special fees and caution deposit.

3. Subsequent instalments will be collected on or before the seventh working day of the month concerned. The specific schedule in this regard shall be decided and published by the Principal. The Principal is competent to effect alterations in the schedule under special situations.

4. Students who fail to pay the fees or special fees on the due date shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs.5.00 along with the fees or special fees on or before the 10th day subsequent to the 7th working day. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday the next working day will be counted as the 10th day.

5. On expiry of the second chance for paying the fees a student will have to pay a fine of Rs.10.00 and a readmission fee of Rs.60.00.

6. The last opportunity for payment of an instalment of fee mentioned above is defined as last working day previous to the due date of the succeeding instalment. However this is not applicable in the case of the last instalment.

7. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance should pay full of the tuition fees for the year together with full special fees and caution deposit at the time of admission.

8. A student who leaves a particular college affiliated to any of the universities in Kerala and joins another college so affiliated during the course of a term is liable to pay the prescribed fees for the term concerned in both the colleges.

9. In the case of students admitted late after the commencement of academic year, the fees for the preceding month if any shall be collected at the time of admission.

10. Refund of fees including special fees once remitted will not be granted except under exceptional circumstances and calls for special orders from the authorities concerned. Zonal Deputy Directors of collegiate education are empowered to sanction refund of fees.

CAUTION DEPOSIT

1. The caution deposit paid by a student for a particular course shall be refunded to him/her after adjusting dues if any upon the completion of the course.
2. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit within the stipulated time.
3. The application for refund of caution deposit shall be submitted in the prescribed form together with the form of receipt.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Students are not permitted to be absent from classes without proper applications for leave submitted in advance. In case of unforeseen circumstances the leave application should be submitted not later than the first day of return to the College.
2. Absence for a period will be considered as absence for a session and absence of one period each in forenoon and afternoon will be considered as absence for the whole day.
3. A student who is absent from the College for more than 12 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to have his/her name removed from the roll and his/her re-admission is subject to the decision of the Principal.
4. The student should have earned at least 75% of the attendance prescribed by the College for promotion to the next senior class.
5. Students seeking exemption from rules relating to minimum attendance should apply for exemption to the University through the principal. Exemption will be given only for twelve days in entire programme in two spells for 2013 admissions. For 2014 admission onwards there are 24 days for a exemption- i.e, 12 days per semester for 2 semesters in entire programme.
6. Students are not entitled to get attendance on producing medical certificate

UNIFORM

Students should wear uniform in specified colour and pattern on all working days except Wednesdays.

IDENTITY CARD

The identity card which is issued to the students at the time of admission shall be retained by the students and produced on demand. Duplicate cards will be issued only under exceptional circumstances and that too at the recommendation of the tutor and on payment of Rs. 50/- by the concerned student. The Identity Card is to be surrendered to the College before the issue of T.C. and Conduct Certificate.

ETIQUETTE

1. With regard to all matters concerned with their conduct in and out of the College, the students of the College are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the best standards of manners and behaviour.
2. Students shall wear clean and respectable dress.
3. In order to maintain order and discipline, students are required to make as little noise as possible when they move from one class to another.
4. When a teacher enters a class the students should rise and remain standing until he/she takes his/her seat or desires them to sit.
5. No student shall enter or leave the class without the permission of the teacher when the class is in progress.
6. Students are not allowed to loiter along the veranda or corridors of the college talking or laughing aloud during class hours. Students who have no class during any particular hour shall remain in the reading room.
7. The students shall handle all College property with care. They are not allowed to disfigure the building or compound walls, desks or benches with any writings, engraving or by sticking bills and posters.
8. Students are not allowed to organise or conduct meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the written permission of the Principal.
9. Smoking and chewing of tobacco are strictly prohibited within the College premises.
10. Use of mobile phones with Camera are banned in the campus. The mobile phone should kept in a switched off mode in the institutions.
11. Students are prohibited from making representation in a body but they can make representations individually to the Principal.
12. Students are not allowed to take part in any agitation or procession which may be accompanied by or may result in illfeeling between different sections of the community, or which tend to excite feelings of disloyalty or dissatisfaction.
13. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual absence during class work, obscenity in word or act are sufficient reasons to be put on record in the punishment register or for being suspended or expelled from the College.
14. A student whose name has gone into the punishment register of the college may not receive a certificate of conduct and character from the Principal.
15. Students should take note of the departmental and other notifications put on the notice board every day before they leave the College. Failure to look at the notice board will not be an excuse for any act of omission or commission on their part.

16. All students of the college are required to carry their identity cards with them.

17. Prohibition of political activity in campus and the penal provisions

NSS Management has decided to ban forthwith all political activities of the students in the campus. No student shall get involved in any political activity by him or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.

Taking part in any political activity by organizing or causing gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any activities as defined in rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.

It shall constitute gross indiscipline to all for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties to their student organizations or students wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed appropriate punishment as mentioned in these rules.

No student of college shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gherao, obstructing entry to and from any class room, office hall or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct.

No student shall shout slogans inside the classrooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct and interfere or cause disturbance and nuisance to the ordinary functioning of the institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.

Court verdict

(Effective from 27.01.16)

The judgement of wp (c) 3177/2016 (V) strictly enforces the direction contained in 2016(1) KLT 180

a) Any student on strike who disrupts the academic activity whether it be lecture, seminar, moot court or tutorials is liable to be removed by the police on complaint made by the head of the department or principal of the college. College authorities can also initiate disciplinary proceedings against the erring student.

b) The members of the teaching faculty are empowered to take classes during strike/ dharna even if there is only one student in the class room and such teaching hour is liable to be reckoned.

c) No student has any sort of right to obstruct other eligible students from entering the classrooms or the portals of a college under the guise of strike, agitation or dharna.

ANTI RAGGING SYSTEM

An anti ragging squad is functioning in the college. In case of any complaint the students can contact the squad members through phone or in person.

Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998

For the information of the students and their parents, the prominent parts, from the Kerala ragging prohibition Act published in 1998, forbidding ragging in the educational institutions of Kerala are quoted below.

1. By Ragging, it is meant any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do something which he/she voluntarily wont dare to do normally.

2. Prohibition of Ragging.

Ragging is prohibited both inside and outside of an educational institution.

3. The punishment for ragging.

Any student involved in ragging/persuades other for ragging or advocates ragging/either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subject to a punishment of not more than two years imprisonment in addition to a penalty not over Rs. 10,000.

4. Dismissal of a student.

A student subject to the punishment under section IV is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of three years from the date of receipt of his/her dismissal order.

5. (1) Suspension of a student.

If a student/parent/guardian or any teacher of the institution forwards a written complaint to the head of the institution, he has to make an urgent enquiry into the matter within 7 days of receipt of such a complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings.

6. (2) As is said in sub-section 1, if a written complaint is received by the head of the institution, he has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found

baseless the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

7. Abetting.

If the head of the institution refuses to take action in the manner described under section 6 or is negligent in initiation of any steps, he is to be treated as one abetting the crime and is liable to be punished under section

MEDICAL INSPECTION

1. Every student of the first year BA., B.Sc. & B.Com. classes will have to undergo Medical Examination by a duly qualified doctor at the beginning of the year and at every alternate year thereafter, and the doctor will submit a report to the Principal.

2. If any deficiency is pointed out by the doctor at the time of medical examination the student concerned shall undergo treatment or resort to such remedies as prescribed by the doctor failing which he/she may be removed from the rolls of the College.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM

A committee is constituted to look into complaints regarding continuous evaluation. Department level committee consists of the HOD, the teacher concerned and Department co-ordinator. The college level committee consists of the Principal, the HOD concerned and college co-ordinator.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

The tutorial system aims to strengthen the teacher-student relationship and also to act as a redressal forum for solving the grievances of the students. Every student is assigned to the care of a tutor. The student can consult the tutor and seek advice on all matters. Tutorial meetings are held weekly and in these meetings the students are encouraged to articulate their suggestions and complaints freely and informally. The tutors are entrusted with the charge of convening class PTA meetings at regular intervals and keeping the guardians informed of the progress of their wards.

FACILITIES

LIBRARY & READING ROOM

The College has a fully automated Central library with a full time librarian and supporting staff. The library is open to the use of the students on all working days from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm. The library has a Central section, a reference section and a section for periodicals. A library advisory committee entrusted by the College Council monitors the functioning of the library.

Library Rules.

1. The Central library and reading room will be opened from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days. The schedule of working during vacation would be duly announced.

2. Books from the Central library will be issued as notified by the librarian.

3. A Library card will be issued to each student which has to be deposited with the librarian on borrowing a book.

4. Students must examine books issued to them and report to the librarian the damage if any, in the books before taking them away.

5. Books taken out by the students shall not be retained for more than 14 days from the date of issue. If the due date falls on a holiday the book must be returned on the next working day. Failure to return the book on the due date entails a fine of one rupee per day.

6. Spoiling or damaging a book by writing on it, underlining passages or by tearing away pages goes against the basic library etiquettes and are punishable with heavy fines.

7. If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated the borrower shall be required to replace the book with a fine or to pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Principal.

8. If books belonging to a set or series are damaged and a new volume is not separately available the borrower shall be required to replace the whole set or series. The damaged book set or series will be given to the borrower after its replacement.

9. Before leaving the counter the borrower shall examine the books taken by them and point out any mutilation or defect in any book to the librarian and have these defects etc. noted in the book and initialled by him. Otherwise the borrowers will be held responsible for any damage or mutilation observed later on.

10. It shall be the duty of the librarian and his staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and take immediate action in all cases of mutilation or damage.

11. The transfer or sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.
12. The papers and periodicals lying on the tables/racks shall not be removed from the slot allotted for each.
13. Strict silence must be observed in the Library/Reading Room.

COMPUTER CENTRE

There is a centralized computer lab functioning in the College which caters to the needs of the students from all the departments. The computer centre offers certificate course in computer application packages and in DTP for the benefit of our students. Internet facility is available here.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

1. Students of the College are required to play games regularly and receive regular course in Physical Education.
2. Provision is made in the College to practice Athletics, Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, Badminton, Shuttle Badminton, Soft ball, Kalarippayattu, Chess, and Boxing.
3. Annual college Sports and intramural tournaments will be conducted on a House basis. The House will be constituted by the Department of Physical Education.
4. The Physical Education Department is also having 12-stage Multi-GYM facility.
5. Recently a full fledged basket-ball court is also constructed with U.G.C. and Kerala State Sports Council support.

AUDITORIUM & SEMINAR HALL

The auditorium and seminar hall of the college are well furnished and provide facilities which enable seminar presentations through audio-visual aids. Besides we are also having an open air auditorium.

GIRLS' ROOM

A well furnished retirement room with toilet facilities constructed by PTA (2009-10) and common room for woman funded by UGC add girls' facilities and comforts.

SPORTS HOSTEL

Sport Hostel attached to the college provides accommodation and provides special consideration to outstanding sportsmen.

WOMEN'S HOSTEL

Women's Hostel offers accommodation and other facilities for 50 students. The Principal of the College shall be the warden of both hostels and he shall appoint a deputy warden who will be in charge of the daily administration. Application form for admission to the hostel can be obtained from the College office. A student, if permitted to reside in the hostel, shall pay the fees in this regard at the time of admission.

CANTEEN

The College canteen provides light refreshments and lunch at a reasonable rate.

DRINKING WATER FACILITY

The college has the facility to provide safe drinking water to students.

CO-OPERATIVE STORE

The College houses a co-operative store inside the campus with the object of carrying out purchase and sale of text books, note books and stationery items. All students of the college and members of the staff are eligible for membership.

PHOTOSTAT

Photocopying facility is available in the College office, Co-operative store, Library & Computer Lab.

POSTAL FACILITY

Postal facility is available for students in the College.

PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM

The public address system echoes important announcements and the communication channel binds the college together.

INTERNET

Internet facility is available in the College Central Library & Departments, apart from computer centre.

WEBSITE

We host our dynamic web site www.prnsscollege.ac.in to make known the activities of the college.

CENTRE FOR CAREER GUIDANCE, COUNSELLING AND EXTENSION

A Centre for career guidance and counselling is functioning in the college. The centre offers career and course guidance services for students at all levels. The centre provides detailed information on the facilities available for higher education available in the field of Arts, Humanities, Science, Engineering and Management in all the universities in Kerala and also in the rest of the universities in India. It arranges special programs for different groups of students for improving their career prospectus with the technical and professional assistance of various organisations and individuals.

The centre is also engaged in providing counselling to the students who are in the delicate stage of adolescence. The counselling programs of the centre will redress the mental and emotional anxiety on the part of adolescents in the campus which may be either due to their ignorance of adolescent issues or due to the lack of life skills to tackle such issues.

Placement Cell

The placement cell functions under the auspices of the career guidance and counseling centre and provides placement assistance to final year students.

STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM

Student Support System extends various kinds of support to the students of our college. Eligible students from difficult financial circumstances are selected and provided with free study materials and food from canteen. In addition to this, unforeseen contingencies of students are also addressed by the system.

UGC CELL

UGC Cell of PRNSS College is functioning as a 5 member group. It is taking decision on UGC related matters like MRP, Seminar, Workshop etc. The cell is circulating the important circulars of UGC for the knowledge of teachers.

RESEARCH CELL

A Research cell is functioning in the college with a view to nurture and to promote research culture among teachers in various disciplines. The members of the cell meet at regular intervals and encourage faculty members to take up research projects. A multidisciplinary journal is published by the cell with scholarly articles of teachers in the college.

ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME

ASAP is a programme initiated by the Government of Kerala. It aims at equipping selected college students with skills in communication and selected areas of industry and service sectors. Our college is an authorized training centre under this programme.

ORGANISATIONS

COLLEGE COUNCIL

The College Council, constituted as per the Kannur University Statutes, would assist and advise the Principal in academic and administrative matters. It is headed by the Principal and has all the Heads of the Departments, Office Superintendent and two elected representatives of the staff as members. A meeting of the Council shall ordinarily be presided over by the Principal or by a councilor nominated by the Principal. A secretary shall be elected from among the members of the Council. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to give notice of the meetings of the council and to keep the record of its proceedings.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The objective of the Association is to foster and promote good will, understanding and co-operation among the faculty, the students and the parents/ guardians of our students. The Association seeks to encourage and facilitate the students in their curricular and co curricular activities. It also strives to devise suitable ways and means to prevent student unrest and also to assist the College authorities in the smooth conduct of the institution. Further it is also the duty of the Association to encourage and participate in the development activities of the College.

Guardians of all students and members of the teaching staff are the members of the PTA. Each guardian should subscribe to the membership with a donation of Rs. 30/- at the time of admission. This amount and any other fund collected by the association will be utilized in consistence with the objectives of the association for the welfare of the College and the student community.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

As a post accreditational quality sustenance mechanism, IQAC functions in the college to plan, monitor and evaluate all administrative and academic activities. The Cell consists of Principal, nine Teachers, two members of the administrative staff, three local experts from the field of education and one parent and management representative each.

COLLEGE UNION

All the students of the college are members of the college union. They shall pay membership fee as directed by the university, with the first instalment of fee.

Office Bearers of the Union are elected by the students every year. The major objectives of the union are to promote awareness of the duties and responsibilities of citizenship, open up avenues for the development of character, leadership qualities, spirit of fellowship and selfless service among the students. Activities considered relevant to achieve these objectives have been regularly organised.

With a view of promoting interest in arts and literature, an arts club is functioning under the auspices of the college Union.

The College Union is affiliated to Kannur University Union.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The College has a rich and varied society of old students who are active in various walks of life. The Alumni Association encourages the former students to keep in touch with their Alma Mater and to maintain contact with one another. The Association also seeks to participate in the developmental activities of the College. Departmental Alumni Associations function to assist activities of respective department and to enable students to keep in touch with their department.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The NCC army wing unit of this College is functioning under the 31 Kerala Branch NCC, Kannur. The aim of NCC is to mould good citizens for the service of the nation. The unit has a strength of 106 cadets comprising 71 boys and 35 girls. NCC training is for 2 years during which time cadets are exposed to military training as well as leadership development programmes. Each cadet will have to earn 75% of attendance in the NCC activities for appearing for "B" and "C" certificate examinations. Trained cadets are eligible for bonus marks for higher education and reservations for jobs.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S)

Two units of National Service Scheme are functioning in the college. The scheme provides opportunities for the students to participate in the process of national reconstruction and individual character formation. Social, educational, cultural and health awareness programmes are organised as a part of its regular activities to promote the leadership qualities and organisational skills. Annual camps are also conducted with special project in rural areas. Members of NSS are awarded grace marks for admission to higher classes.

CLUBS AND FORUMS

COLLEGE LEVEL

Nature Club: Affiliated to Nature Club of India Movement of WWF India. Aims to inculcate an awareness and appreciation of nature among the youth and also to motivate a concern for participating in conservation of nature and natural resources.

Entrepreneurship Development Club: A part of the statewide scheme formulated by the Department of Industries and Commerce, Govt. of Kerala, in association with the Department of Education to inculcate entrepreneurial culture among the students.

Tourism Club: Affiliated to District Tourism Promotion Council, Kannur, with the District Collector as Chairman, a forum for creating awareness on tourism among the youth, to undertake the protection of ingenious art and culture and to impart better understanding of our heritage to promote national integration.

Health Club: To create awareness among the academic community about maintaining a healthy life style through regular exercise and proper food habits.

Book Club: To promote the habit of reading and to inculcate an awareness on current social responsibilities among the students through theme based discussions.

Women's Cell: Aims to ensure the welfare of girl students and to make them aware of gender related issues. The cell would also act as a grievance redressal forum for women.

Arts Forum: College provides ample opportunities to develop talents in different forms of art. Students are encourage to take part in competitions held outside the campus.

Staff Club: Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff have their staff clubs which support academic, curricular and co-curricular activities and for recreation.

DEPARTMENTAL

Avant-garde, the English Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of English to promote curricular & co-curricular activities of the students of English Literature.

Iris Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of English. The club provides a platform for students who have a genuine interest in journalism, photography, films and arts.

Pragati Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of Hindi coordinates the curricular and co-curricular activities of the Hindi Students.

Literary Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of Malayalam. Aims to foster an awareness of the new trends and developments in literature and cultural studies and to encourage the creative talents of the students.

ECONSS: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of Economics to promote curricular and co-curricular activities of the economics students.

Pazhassi Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of History the club coordinates curricular and co-curricular activities of the History students.

Pazhassi Museum and Archives: An extension work undertaken by the Department of History to preserve the historical documents and monuments related to the legendary freedom fighter Kottayam Kerala Varma Raja (Pazhassi Thampuran) from whom the College gets its name.

Evergreen Club: Functioning under auspices of Botany Department. It is a platform for conducting extra curricular and extension activities of the Department of Botany.

Kekule Club: Functioning under the auspices of Chemistry Department to provide a forum for the coordination of curricular and co-curricular activities of chemistry students.

Compactum Club: Functioning under the auspices of Mathematics Department and aims to improve mathematical skills of the student community.

Specturm Club: Functioning under the auspices of the Department of Physics the club coordinates curricular and co-curricular activities of the physics students.

Zoology Club: Functioning under the auspices of Zoology Department to promote interest in issues of biological significance and to familiarize the students with the emerging areas in biological sciences.

Rain dot Com: A forum which coordinates the co-curricular and recreational activities of the commerce students.

Bhoomithrasena Club: The Bhoomithrasena Club started its activity in the campus since 2011 - 2012 academic year onwards. The main objective of the club is creating awareness among the students and general public about the necessity of environmental protection. Department of environment and climate change provide proper direction for the smooth functioning of the club. A faculty co-ordinator and a leader from the part of club members are appointed to co-ordinate activities of the club. The activities is mainly concentrated on environmental issues.

PUBLICATIONS

COLLEGE CALENDAR & HAND BOOK

The college calendar & hand book containing a detailed profile of the College and an academic year planner is published every year and distributed free of cost to the students.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

Students are initiated to creative as well as journalistic writings and other forms of literary contributions through the College Magazine. All the students of the College are subscribers of the College Magazine. An editorial board consisting of teachers and elected representatives of the students is responsible for the publication of the College Magazine.

IMPRESSIONS

College publishes an annual news letter "IMPRESSIONS" with a precise account of curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities of the year.

CLUB/DEPARTMENT PUBLICATIONS

In addition to the above mentioned publications various departments and clubs publish news letters and manuscript magazines. Zoology Department publishes 'SKYLARK' yearly and Chemistry Department publishes 'PAZHASSI CHEM' half yearly.

KANNUR UNIVERSITY
Regulations For Choice Based Credit and
Semester System For Under Graduate
Programme in Affiliated Colleges -2019
(in OBE – Outcome Based Education – system)

1. TITLE, APPLICATION AND COMMENCEMENT

1.1 These regulations may be called “Kannur University Regulations for Choice Based Credit and Semester System for Under-Graduate Programme 2019” (in OBE – Outcome Based Education – system) (KUCBCSSUG 2019)

1.2 The regulations provided herein shall apply to all regular First Degree (undergraduate) programmes conducted in colleges and institutions affiliated to the Kannur University, coming under the Faculties of Science, Technology, Humanities, Social Sciences, Language & Literature, Commerce and Management Studies, Fine Arts, Communication, and such other faculties as decided by the University from time to time .

1.3 These regulations shall come into force with effect from the academic year 2019-2020 onwards.

1.4 These regulations shall not apply to Distance Education Programmes.

1.5 The provisions herein shall supersede all the existing regulations for the regular under-graduate programmes to the extent herein prescribed.

2. DEFINITIONS: In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:

2.1 **‘Academic Week’** is a unit of five working days in which distribution of work is organised from day one to day five (normally, Monday to Friday), with five contact hours of one hour duration on each day. A sequence of 18 such academic weeks constitutes a semester.

2.2 **‘College Co-ordinator’** is a teacher nominated by the college council to co-ordinate the effective running of CBCSS and the process of continuous evaluation undertaken by various departments within the college. She / He shall be nominated to the College level Grievance Redressal Cell.

2.3 **‘College Council’** means the body of all Heads of the Departments and elected members among teachers as per the Kannur University Statutes.

2.4 **‘Complementary Elective Course’** (CEC) means a course which is generally related to the core course which supplements the core course, (traditionally referred to as complementary course)

2.5 **‘Common course’** means a course that comes under the category of courses, including compulsory English Common Courses(ECC) and Additional

Common Courses(ACC) and a set of General Awareness Courses(GAC) applicable for Language Reduced Pattern (LRP) programmes, a selection of which is compulsory for all students undergoing undergraduate programmes.

2.6 '**Core course**' (CC) means a compulsory course in a subject related to a particular degree programme which may include Discipline Specific Elective Course(s) (DSEC).

2.7 '**Course**' means a segment of subject matter to be covered in a semester.

2.8 **Course teacher(s)**: Teacher(s) in charge of a particular course as decided by the department council.

2.9 '**Credit**' (C) is a unit of academic input measured in proportion to weekly contact hours /course contents assigned to a course.

2.10 '**Credit Point**' (CP) of a course is the value obtained by multiplying the grade point (GP) by the credit (C) of the course: $CP = GP \times C$.

2.11 **Credit Point (CP) of a semester** is the product of SGPA of that semester and the total credit load of that semester.

CP=SGPA x Credit of the semester

2.12 '**Cumulative Grade Point Average**'(CGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the courses taken by the student for the completed semesters by the total number of credits acquired so far and shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

CGPA= Sum of the Credit Points secured in completed semesters/ Total Credit for the completed semesters

2.13 '**Department**' means any teaching department in a College offering a programme/course of study approved by the university, as per the Statutes and Act of the university.

2.14 '**Department Co-ordinator**' is a teacher nominated by the Department Council to coordinate the continuous evaluation process undertaken in that department.

2.15 '**Department Council**' means the body of all teachers of a department in a college.

2.16 '**Duration of programme**' means the time period required for the conduct of the programme. The duration of an under graduate degree programme shall be six semesters distributed in a period of three academic years.

2.17 '**Faculty Adviser**' means a teacher from the parent department nominated by the Department council, who will advise the students in the academic matters and in the choice of Generic Elective course.

2.18 '**General Awareness Course**' means a course that comes under the

category of those programmes in which English Common Course and Additional Common Course are limited to first and second semesters (compulsory for all students undergoing LRP/similar programmes).

2.19 '**Generic Elective course**' means a course which can be opted by a student in fifth semester of the programme at her/his choice from other disciplines apart from her/his Core subject (GEC), (traditionally referred to as open course)

2.20 **Grade Card** means the official record of student's performance, awarded to her/him. Each letter grade is assigned a '**Grade Point**' (GP) which is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in a course. "**Grade Point**" means point given to a grade on the scale as provided under clause 9.

Grade Point = (Total marks awarded / Total Maximum marks) x 10

2.21 '**Improvement course**' is a course registered by a student for improving her/his performance in that particular course.

2.22 '**Letter Grade**' or simply 'Grade' in a course is a letter symbol (A+, A, B, C, D, E, and F). Grade means the prescribed alphabetical grade awarded to a student based on her/his performance in various examinations. The Letter grade that corresponds to arrange of CGPA is given in clause 9

2.23 '**Overall Grade Point Average**' (OGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the semesters taken by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credits in the entire programme and shall be rounded off to three decimal places. OGPA is the final grade point average after completing six semesters.

2.24 '**Parent Department**' means the Department which offers a particular degree programme.

2.25 '**Programme**' means the entire course of study and examinations for the award of an under graduate degree.

2.26 '**Repeat course**' is a course that is repeated by a student in a semester for want of sufficient attendance. She/ He can repeat the course whenever it is offered again.

2.27 '**Semester**' means a term consisting of 90 working days including examination days.

2.28 '**Semester Grade Point Average**' (SGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points obtained by a student in various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits in that semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places. SGPA determines the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester.

SGPA = Sum of the Credit Points of the courses for the semester/ Sum of the Credits for the Semester

2.29 **'Strike off the roll'**: means removing a student who is continuously absent for 14 days without sufficient reason and proper intimation to the Principal of the college from the roll after following the procedure prescribed.

2.30 Words and expressions used and not defined in these regulations, but defined in the Kannur University Act, Statutes and Ordinances shall have the meaning respectively assigned to them in the Act, the Statutes and the Ordinances.

3. ADMISSION AND REGISTRATION

3.1 Eligibility for admissions and reservation of seats for various First Degree (Under Graduate) Programmes shall be according to the rules framed by the University from time to time. No student shall be eligible for admission to a Undergraduate Degree Programme in any of the discipline unless she/ he has successfully completed the examination conducted by a Board/University at the +2 level of schooling or its equivalent, as recognised by the University.

3.2 Student enrolment shall be in accordance with the academic and physical facilities available in the Institution. The College shall make available to all students a brochure listing all the courses offered by the various departments in the entire programme and the number of seats sanctioned by the University for each Programme.

3.3 The maximum number of students to be admitted to a Programme shall be limited to the number of seats sanctioned by the University.

3.4 The College/ University shall publish a Prospectus listing all the programmes indicating Core and Complementary Elective course offered in various Departments during a particular semester.

3.5 There shall be a uniform **Academic cum Examinations calendar** approved by the University for the registration, conduct and scheduling of examinations, and publication of results. The Academic cum Examinations Calendar shall be complied with by all colleges and offices, and the Vice Chancellor shall have all powers necessary for this purpose.

3.6 Each student shall register for the courses she/he proposes to take in a semester through 'online', in consultation with the Faculty Adviser.

3.7 No separate minimum intake shall be prescribed for Generic Elective Courses.

3.8 The maximum age limit for admission to the UG programme shall be 23 years as on 1st June of the academic year. For SC/ST candidates the age limit is 25 years as on 1st June of the academic year.

3.9 The college shall send a list of the students registered for each Programme in each semester giving the details of programmes for which each of the students has registered including the repeat/reappearance Courses, to the Registrar /

Controller of Examinations in the prescribed format as and when required.

3.10 Depending upon the academic and physical facilities available in the colleges and institutions, the University may allow the colleges and institutions to admit a certain number of students in third or fifth semester from other Institutions by college transfer or inter university transfer within a period of two weeks from the date of commencement of the semester. The institutions and the candidate have to make ensure that scheme, syllabus and the total credits of the programme in the complete semesters shall be same in both institutions. Inter collegiate transfer will be permitted to the students who pursue her/his study in the same core course opted for the programme, as per the rules framed separately for this purpose. If the number of applicants are more than the available vacancies, rank list should be prepared by the college or institution based on their merit, and the applications are to be forwarded to the Registrar along with the rank list recommending the most eligible candidate.

3.11 Provision for **credit transfer** is subject to common guidelines prepared by the faculty concerned.

3.12 There shall be provision for **readmission** of students already registered under “Kannur University Regulations for Choice Based Credit and Semester System for Under-Graduate Programme 2019” subject to the conditions that

- i) There should be a gap of at least one semester for readmission.
- ii) The candidate seeking readmission to a particular semester should have registered for the previous semester examination.
- iii) There should not be any change in the scheme and syllabus .If there is a change in the scheme and syllabus, readmission may be given in consultation with the Board of Studies concerned and the Examination Branch.
- iv) For readmission, the vacancy should be within the statutory limit.
- v) Re admission shall be made within 14 days of the commencement of classes.

3.13 Those students who have registered for First Degree(Under Graduate) programmes in annual pattern or Choice based Credit & Semester system under the regulations in force from 2009 to 2018 admissions but could not successfully complete the programme, may cancel their earlier registration and register afresh for Under Graduate Programmes under these regulations in the same discipline or a different one subject to the age limit prescribed under 3.8.

4. PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

4.1 **Duration:** The duration of an under graduate programme shall be six semesters inclusive of days of examinations distributed over a period of three academic years. The odd semesters (1, 3, 5) shall be from June to October and the even semesters (2,4, 6) shall be from October/November to March. Each

semester shall have 90 working days inclusive of days of all examinations. No student shall be allowed to complete the Programme by attending more than 12 semesters.

4.2 Courses: The under graduate programme shall include four types of courses, viz., Common Courses (Code A), Core courses (Code B), Complementary elective courses (Code C) and Generic Elective course (Code D).

4.3 Course code: Each course shall have a unique alphanumeric code number, which includes abbreviation of the semester number (1 to 6) in which the course is offered, the code of the course (A to D), of the subject in three letters and the serial number of the course (01, 02, 03 etc). Course code will be centrally generated by the Board of Studies of the university. For example 2A03ENG represents a Common English course of serial number 03 offered in the second semester and 2B02PHY represents Core course of serial number 02 offered in the second semester in Physics programme. *A particular complementary elective course in a semester should have same code with same credit even though it is offered for different programmes.*

4.4 Common courses: Every under graduate student shall undergo 10 common courses (Total 38 credits) **chosen from a group of 14 common courses listed below, for completing the programme:**

1. English Common Course I
2. English Common Course II
3. English Common Course III
4. English Common Course IV
5. English Common Course V
6. English Common Course VI
7. Additional Common Course I
8. Additional Common Course II
9. Additional Common Course III
10. Additional Common Course IV
11. General Awareness Course I
12. General Awareness Course II
13. General Awareness Course III
14. General Awareness Course IV

Common courses 1-6 shall be taught by teachers of English department and 7-10 by teachers of other language departments and general awareness courses 11-14 by teachers of departments offering core courses concerned.

General awareness courses shall be designed by the concerned Board of Studies.

The common course 1 to 6 and General Awareness Course 11 to 14 will cover aspects of Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) based on the directives from Supreme Court, High Court, Central/ State/ Local Governments/ other Agencies, The Kerala State Higher Education Council etc from time to time. The Board of studies concerned shall prescribe syllabus accordingly and may submit the syllabus in piecemeal if necessary before the commencement of the classes.

4.5 Core courses: Core courses are the courses in the main subject of the degree programme chosen by the student. Core courses are offered by the parent department.

4.6 Complementary Elective courses: Complementary Elective courses cover one or two disciplines that are related to the core subject to supplement it and are distributed in the first four semesters.

4.7 Generic Elective Courses: There shall be one Generic Elective Course in the fifth semester. This course shall be open to all the students in the institution except the students in the parent department. The students of parent department can opt that course from any other department in the institution. Each department shall offer a five Generic Elective course.

4.8 Credits: Each course shall have certain credits. For passing the degree programme the student shall be required to achieve a minimum of 120 credits of which 38 shall be for common course (22 for English Common Courses ; 16 for common additional languages other than English).In the case of LRP Programmes 14 credits for common English courses, 8 credits for Additional common courses and 16 credits for General. Awareness courses. Minimum credits required for core, complementary elective and Generic Elective courses put together are 82.However the credits to be set apart for the core and complementary elective courses shall be decided by the Board of Studies concerned. The maximum credits for a course shall not exceed 5. Honours programmes will have separate credit distribution.

4.9 Attendance: A student shall be permitted to appear for the semester examination, only if she/he secures not less than 75% attendance in all courses of a semester put together . Records of attendance shall be maintained by the concerned Department for a period of six years and the attendance register shall be made available for verification, as and when required by the University.

4.10 Only those students who are registered for the university examination with eligible attendance (including those under condonable limit) alone are eligible to be promoted to next semester. Students who have attendance in the prescribed limit but could not register for examination are eligible to move to the next semester after availing token registration. The candidates shall apply for token registration within two weeks of the commencement of the next semester. Token registration is allowed only once during the entire programme.

It shall be the duty of the Principal to ensure that only eligible candidates are promoted to the next semester. The Vice Chancellor shall be competent to cancel the ineligible promotion and impose penalty on the Principal.

4.11 Condonation: Students are eligible for the condonation of shortage of attendance for a maximum of 14 days in a semester subject to a maximum two times during the whole period of an Under Graduate Programme. Condonation of shortage of attendance may be granted by the Vice Chancellor on production of the medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner for the days absent. Students who attend, with prior concurrence from the Head of the department/ institution, the approved co-curricular activities of college/university/higher level /other agencies approved by the Principal are eligible to get their lost days treated as 'Present' on submission of an application to the Principal through the head of the Department with a certificate of participation / attendance certificate in such activities, provided the student concerned must receive the required course of instruction in lieu of the days/hours lost as may be decided by the Head of The Department/ Principal. A student who is not eligible for condonation of shortage of attendance shall repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch by availing re admission.

4.12 Admission to Repeat courses shall be within the sanctioned strength including marginal increase. However if the number of candidates applied exceeds the sanctioned strength, those students who have discontinued the programme on account of serious health problems, may be permitted to repeat the course on production of a medical certificate issued by a physician not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon in Government service, after obtaining permission from the Registrar of the University. Those students who are meritorious in sports activities are eligible to repeat fifth and sixth semesters of the programme if they so desire, under N+1 or N+2 category with the permission of the university, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Physical Education, Head of the parent Department of and the Principal of the College after cancelling their registration of fifth and sixth semester examinations, provided those students who pass the semester examinations will not be granted permission to repeat the courses under this category. Those candidates who could not successfully complete the programme under N+1 category are eligible to repeat courses under N+ 2 categories under the same conditions under N+1.

4.13 If a student registered in first semester of the UG degree programme is continuously absent from the classes for more than 14 days at the beginning of the first semester without intimation to the Principal, the matter shall immediately be brought to the notice of the Registrar of the university, by the Principal. The names of such students shall be removed from the rolls. A student who is continuously absent for 14 days during a semester without sufficient reason and proper intimation to the Principal of the college shall be removed from the roll provided before removing the student from the roll, the Principal shall consult the College Council and shall communicate the student the decision of the college council

giving the student a reasonable time to file appeals/ complaints if any to the Principal before the date of Strike off the roll. Such appeals/ complaints shall be considered by the College Council for further proceedings.

4.14 Grace marks: Grace Marks shall be awarded to a student for meritorious achievements in co-curricular activities (in Sports/Arts/ NSS/NCC) carried out besides the regular class hours. Such a benefit is applicable and limited to each academic year spreading over three years (6 Semesters). No separate credit shall be assigned for such activities. Grace marks shall be awarded to other eligible candidates as per University orders in this regard from time to time.

5. EXAMINATION

5.1 There shall be University examinations at the end of each semester. A candidate who fails to register for University Examination shall not be permitted to move to next semester

5.2 **Practical** examinations shall be conducted by the University at the end of the semester. If necessary, it shall be conducted before the End Semester Evaluation.

5.3 **External Viva-voce**, if any, shall be conducted along with the practical examination/project evaluation.

5.4 **Project** evaluation shall be conducted at the end of sixth semester. 20 % of marks are awarded through continuous evaluation.

5.5 **Improvement:** Improvement of courses in a particular semester can be done only once. The student shall avail the improvement chance in the succeeding year along with subsequent batch.. If the candidate fails to appear for the improvement examination after registration, or if there is no change in the results of the improvement examination, the mark/grade obtained in the first appearance will be retained. Candidates may be permitted to cancel their improvement registration/appearance if applied before the publication of results, and after that application for cancellation shall not be permitted. To avoid a situation of undergoing two courses of study during the same academic year, those candidates who intend to avail improvement chance after successful completion of the Programme, shall surrender their Grade Cards and submit their Transfer Certificate to the University along with application for registration for examination. Transfer Certificate shall be returned to the students after releasing the hall tickets and fresh Grade Card shall be issued incorporating the improvement results. There shall be no improvement chance for continuous evaluation, project/viva voce/practical. The internal marks already obtained will be carried forward to determine the new grade/mark in the improvement examination.

5.6 There shall be no supplementary examinations. For reappearance/ improvement the students shall appear along with students of subsequent

admissions as and when the examinations are conducted by the University.

6. EVALUATION :

6.1 Course Evaluation:

The evaluation scheme for each course shall contain two parts

a) Continuous Evaluation (CE) b) End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

20% weightage shall be given to the Continuous Evaluation(CE) and 80% weightage shall be for the End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

6.2 Continuous Evaluation (CE):

a. 20% of the total marks in each course are for continuous assessment. The continuous evaluation shall be based on a pre determined transparent system involving any of the two components- For theory course: written test , assignments, seminars, Viva etc For practical course: lab involvement , records, written test etc

b. Two components and their respective weightages shall be as prescribed in the scheme and syllabus by the Board of Studies concerned.

c. Attendance *shall not be* a component for Continuous Evaluation(CE).

6.3 To ensure transparency of the evaluation process, the continuous evaluation marks awarded to the students in each component of each course in a semester shall be notified on the notice board at least three days before the commencement of End Semester Evaluation. There shall not be any chance for improvement for Continuous Evaluation. Only the total CE marks awarded to a candidate in each course need be sent to university by the Principal of colleges concerned. The College shall maintain the academic record of each student registered for the course, with the details of the marks awarded to each component of Continuous Evaluation of courses with the signatures of the students, course teacher and HOD which shall be preserved in the college for a period of six years from the last date of the End Semester Examination of the semester concerned and shall be made available to the University for inspection as and when required. Complaints if any with regard to the Continuous Evaluation shall be submitted by the student to the Course Teacher first. If the student feels that justice is denied, she/he can submit appeal to Head of the Department and thereafter to the Principal of the College. The Department Council/ College Council shall consider the complaint and ensure that assessments are done by the teacher in a just and fair manner. In case the student is not satisfied with the decision at the college level, further appeal/complaints may be submitted by the student to the Controller of Examinations, Kannur University for being placed before the University Level Committee for consideration.

6.4 End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

End Semester Evaluation carries 80% of total marks. The End Semester

Evaluation in theory courses are to be conducted with question papers set by external experts. The evaluation of the answer scripts shall be done by examiners appointed by the University based on a well-defined Scheme of valuation and answer keys provided by the University. After the End Semester Evaluation only marks are to be entered in the answer scripts. Marks secured for End Semester Evaluation only need be communicated to University. All other calculations including grading are done by the university by the Chairperson of Board of Examiners. The End Semester Evaluation in practical courses shall be conducted by two examiners (one internal and one external) appointed by the University. End Semester Evaluation of all semesters will be conducted in centralised valuation camps immediately after the examination. All question papers shall be set by the university.

6.5 Project Evaluation: Every student of a UG Programme shall have to work on a project (credit of which shall be decided by the concerned Board of Studies) under the supervision of a faculty member as per the curriculum. Projects shall be submitted in the last week of February in sixth semester. Belated and incomplete projects will not be entertained. Project evaluation shall be conducted at the end of sixth semester as per the following general guidelines or by the guidelines framed by the Board of Studies concerned:

1. Evaluation of the Project Report shall be done under Mark System.
2. The evaluation of the project will be done at two stages:
 - a) Continuous Evaluation (supervising teachers will assess the project and award internal Marks)
 - b) End Semester Evaluation (external examiner appointed by the University)
3. Marks secured for the project will be awarded to candidates, combining the Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Evaluation marks.
4. The Continuous Evaluation to End Semester Evaluation components is to be taken in the ratio 1:4. Assessment of different components may be taken as below.
5. Components of Continuous Evaluation and End Semester Evaluation of Project other than the following can be decided by the concerned Board of Studies.
6. External Examiners will be appointed by the University from the list of VI semester Board of Examiners in consultation with the Chairperson of the Board.
7. The chairman of the VI semester examination should form and coordinate the evaluation teams and their work.
8. Continuous Evaluation should be completed 2 weeks before the last working day of VIth semester.

9. Continuous Evaluation marks should be published in the department.
10. In the case of courses with practical examination, project evaluation shall be done along with practical examinations.
11. Chairman Board of Examinations, may at his discretion, on urgent requirements, make certain exception in the guidelines for the smooth conduct of the evaluation of project.
12. Submission of the Project Report and presence of the student for viva are compulsory for Continuous Evaluation. No marks shall be awarded to a candidate if she/he fails to submit the Project Report for End Semester Evaluation.
13. The student should get a minimum of 40 % marks of the aggregate and 40% separately for ESE and 10% CE for pass in the project.
14. There shall be no improvement chance for the Marks obtained in the Project Report.
15. In an instance of inability of obtaining a minimum pass marks as required under clause 12, the project work shall be re- done and the report may be re-submitted along with subsequent exams through parent department.

7. GRADING:

7.1 Indirect Grading System based on the scale specified in clause 9.2 is used to evaluate the performance of students.

7.2 Indirect grading system shall be adopted for the assessment of a student's performance in a course (both CE and ESE) Each course is evaluated by assigning marks with a letter grade (A+, A, B, C, D, E and F) to that course by the method of indirect grading. Mark system is followed instead of direct grading for each question. For each course in the semester, letter grade, grade point and percentage of marks are introduced in the indirect grading system with scale as per guidelines given below:

7.3 Evaluation (both CE and ESE) is carried out using Mark system .The grading on the basis of a total CE and ESE marks will be indicated for each

course: Each letter grade is assigned a 'Grade point' (GP) which is a point given to a grade on the scale as envisaged under clause 9.2 and is obtained using the formula:

Grade Point = (Total marks awarded / Total Maximum marks) x 10.

7.4 'Credit point' (CP) of a course is the value obtained by multiplying the grade point (GP) by the credit (C) of the course

$$CP = GP \times C$$

A minimum of grade point 4 is needed for the successful completion of a course.

7.5 A candidate securing not less than 40% of aggregate marks of a course with not less than 40% in End Semester Evaluation(ESE)and not less than 10% in Continuous Evaluation (CE) separately shall be declared to have passed in that course. A minimum of grade point 4 with letter grade E is needed for the successful completion of a course.

7.6 Appearance for Continuous Evaluation (CE) and End Semester Evaluation (ESE) are compulsory and no grade shall be awarded to a candidate if she/he is absent for CE/ESE or both.

7.7 After the successful completion of a semester, Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) of a student in that semester is calculated using the formula given below.

$$SGPA = \frac{\text{Sum of the Credit Points of all courses in a semester}}{\text{Total Credits in that semester}}$$

Semester Grade Point Average' (SGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points obtained by a student in the various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits in that semester. SGPA determines the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester.

For the successful completion of a semester, a student should pass all courses in that semester. However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of SGPA obtained. SGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

7.8 The **Cumulative Grade Point Average** (CGPA) of the student is calculated at the end of each semester. The CGPA of a student determines the overall academic level of the student in each stage of the programme. CGPA can be calculated by the following formula:

$$CGPA = \frac{\text{Sum of Credit Points of all completed semesters}}{\text{Total Credits acquired}}$$

CGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

7.9 At the end of the programme, the over all performance of a candidate is indicated by the Overall Grade Point Average . Overall **Grade Point Average (OGPA)** of the student is calculated at the end of the programme. The OGPA of a student determines the overall academic level the student in a programme and is the criterion for classification and ranking the students. OGPA can be calculated by the following formula

$$\text{OGPA} = \frac{\text{Sum of Credit Points obtained in all semesters of the programme}}{\text{Total Credits (120)}}$$

OGPA shall be rounded off to three decimal places.

An overall letter grade for **OGPA** for the entire programme shall be awarded to a student after completing the entire programme successfully .Over all letter grade based on OGPA and conversion of Grades into classification shall be in the following way.

7.10 The Percentage of marks based on OGPA is calculated by multiplying them by 10.

Percentage in two decimal places = [OGPA in three decimal places] x 10%

7.11 Those candidates who pass all the courses prescribed for a programme shall be declared to have successfully completed the programme and eligible for the degree. Minimum OGPA required for the successful completion of the degree programme is 4. In the event a candidate fails to secure pass in any course in a semester, consolidation of SGPA and CGPA will be made only after obtaining pass in the failed course in the subsequent appearance, as envisaged in clause 7.5.

7.12 A student who fails to secure a minimum mark for a pass in a course is permitted to write the examination along with the subsequent batch.

7.13 **Moderation:** Moderation shall be decided by the concerned Board of examiners subject to the Statistics of marks made available from the

Examination branch and as per the prescribed guidelines.

7.14 Revaluation: In the new system revaluation is permissible. The prevailing rules and regulations of revaluation are applicable to KUCBCSSUG2019.

8. GRADE CARD

8.1 The University shall issue to the students grade/marks card (by online) on completion of each semester, which shall contain the following information:

- a) Name of University
- b) Name of college
- c) Month and Year of examination
- d) Title of Under-Graduate Programme
- e) Semester concerned
- f) Name and Register Number of student
- g) Course Code, Title and Credits of each course opted in the semester
- h) Continuous Evaluation marks, End Semester Evaluation marks, total marks, Grade point (G), Credit point and Letter grade in each course in the semester
- i) The total credits, total credit points and SGPA in the semester (corrected to three decimal places)
- j) Percentage of total marks and CGPA separately.

8.2 The **final Grade/mark Card** issued at the end of the final semester shall contain the details of all courses taken during the entire programme including those taken over and above the prescribed minimum credits for obtaining the degree. The final grade card shall show the percentage of total marks, OGPA (corrected to three decimal places) and the overall letter grade of a student for the entire programme. The final grade/mark card shall also include the grade points and letter grade of common course, core courses, complementary elective courses and generic elective courses separately. If the students are in need of separate grade card of each semester for the purpose of higher studies, the same shall be issued on attestation by the Controller of Examinations / Joint Registrar/ Deputy Registrar/ Assistant Registrar after levying the prescribed fee.

9. AWARD OF DEGREE

9.1 For the successful completion of all the courses (common, core, complementary elective and generic elective courses) a candidate has to secure minimum E grade as provided in clause 9. Satisfying the minimum credit 120 and securing minimum OGPA 4 shall be the minimum requirement for the award of degree. Position certificate up to 10th position will be issued on the basis of highest OGPA secured for the programme.

9.2 Degree for Oriental Title Courses: Those students who have passed Oriental Title courses earlier have to appear for the common courses A 01 to A 06 in order to get POT degree. This can be done through SDE registration, as per the Regulations prescribed for this purpose.

9.3 For obtaining additional degree: Those students who have passed UG programme except in LRP under KUCBCSSUG 2019 have to appear only core, Complementary Elective and Generic Elective courses for acquiring additional degree. Those who have passed UG Programme through LRP have to appear for all courses offered in the programme. The registration for additional degree shall be done through SDE in the second year, as per the prevailing rules in the University, and have to complete the programme within two academic years. The additional degree certificate signed by the Controller of Examinations stating the details of the degree already awarded, and the examination passed by the candidates under this clause, will be issued to successful candidates.

10. MONITORING OF THE PROGRAMME AND GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM

10.1 College level: Every programme conducted under the Choice Based Credit and Semester System in a College shall be monitored by the College Council. The College shall form a Grievance Redressal Committee in each department comprising of course teacher and one senior teacher as members and the Head of the department as chairperson. This committee shall address all grievances relating to the continuous evaluation marks of the students. There shall be a college level Grievance Redressal Committee comprising of staff advisor of College Union as Convenor, Chairperson of College Union, General Secretary of College Union, two senior teachers and two members elected by the College Council from among the teachers of the College as members and Principal as Chairperson.

10.2 University level: The University shall form a Grievance Redressal Committee under the chairmanship of Pro-Vice Chancellor as the Chairperson with Convenors of Standing Committees of Examinations, and Student Welfare, Controller of Examinations as Convenor, One Senior officer in Examination branch not below the rank of Joint Registrar/Deputy Registrar , Director of Student Services, University Union Chairperson, University Union General Secretary as members to consider the complaints/appeal from students with regard to Continuous Evaluation or any other matter coming under the purview of these regulations .

11. TRANSITORY PROVISION

Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Vice-Chancellor shall, for a period of three year from the date of coming into force of these regulations, have the power to make provisions by order to address any issues arising out of the implementation of these regulations for solution of which

no provisions are explicitly provided in these regulations. All such decisions taken by the Vice Chancellor shall be reported to the Academic Council and the Syndicate.

12. REPEAL

The Regulations now in force in so far as they are applicable to Under Graduate programmes offered by the University and to the extent they are inconsistent with these regulations stand repealed. In the case of any inconsistency between any other existing regulations and these regulations relating to the Choice-based Credit Semester System 2019 in their application to any programme offered in a College, the latter shall prevail.
